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Desertification and draught day 17th of June 2024 Suggested activities

Activity 1

Water Conservation Week

This activity helps students to understand the importance of water in their everyday lives.

Instructions: students evaluate their water usage and implement strategies to reduce it. They create posters or infographics about ways to save water at home and in their communities.

Materials needed: paper, pencils, colours.

Activity 2

Planting Drought-Resistant Plants or Trees

This activity helps students to understand how planting trees helps combat desertification by stabilizing the soil and retaining water.

Instructions: students plant drought-resistant species to promote reforestation and discuss how planting trees helps combat desertification by stabilizing the soil and retaining water.

Materials needed: trees or other plants to plant, shovels.

Activity 3

Art Contest: "Draw a Greener Future"

This activity makes students think about how to prevent desertification and make our planet greener.

Instructions: organize an art contest where students illustrate solutions to combat desertification or depict a future where desertification has been reversed. Display the artwork around the school or online.

Materials needed: paper, pencils, colours, old magazines or newspapers, scissors.

Activity 4

Role-Playing Game "Survive the Drought"

This activity encourages students to discuss and search for solutions how to combat desertification and draught.

Instructions: play a game where students take on roles of farmers, government officials or environmentalists dealing with a drought situation. During the game students have to make decisions about resource management, crop selection and community responses.

Materials needed: role cards.
